Girls find their best form just in the nick of time

WINSFORD Ladies have climbed clear of the relegation zone after successive victories over the past seven days.

Tony Lee's team bagged bragging rights after toppling neighbours Frodsham Rangers by the odd goal in five in midweek, following that with a crushing win at Bolton Ambassadors on Sunday.

They have now won four of their past five matches.

"Its great to keep up our good run of form, " said Lee.

"Frodsham were always going to be tough opponents having been unbeaten in their past six games, but we were on top after half time and Nicky's goals gave us the breathing space we needed."

Sarah Lee opened the scoring on Thursday, a brace from Nicky Cooke stretched their advantage before the visitors rallied to score twice in the closing stages.

Cooke helped herself to another double at Bolton, where Winsford went on to win 4 – 1 despite missing a host of players.

Ashleigh Kerr was another to net twice in a one-sided encounter.

"We could have scored many more because the girls dominated from start to finish," said Lee.

Winsford are now ninth in the North West Women's Regional League Division One South, although they face two of the leading teams – GMP and Denton Town – at Barton Stadium this week.
